## **activist**

A person who feels strongly about helping people, other living things or the planet.

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## **artist**

A person who creates works of art, including pieces of music, plays, poems, paintings, dances or sculptures.

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## **campaign**

A planned set of activities to reach a goal.

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## **Dawson's model**

A set of five statements that help decide if a person is historically significant.

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## **diamond ranking**

A way of organising information from most to least important.

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## **discovery**

The act of finding something that had not been known before.

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## **explorer**

A person who travels to places to find out what is there.

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## **fact**

Something that is known or true.

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## **invention**

The process of creating something that has never been made before.

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## **monarch**

A king or queen who rules a kingdom.



**monument**

A structure built to honour a special person or event.

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**opinion**

A thought or belief about something.

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**protest**

To disagree with something and complain strongly.

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**rights**

The things that a person is entitled to have.

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**role model**

Someone you admire whose behaviour you aim to copy.

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**scientist**

A person who discovers or invents new things.

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**significant**

A person who is great, important or worthy of attention.

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**speech**

A formal talk usually given to a large number of people.

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**statue**

A stone or metal object made to look like a person.

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**suffragette**

A woman who campaigned for women’s right to vote.

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**timeline**

A way of displaying events in chronological order.



**viewpoint**

A person's own opinion or way of thinking about something.

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**vote**

To express your opinion by marking a ballot paper or raising your hand.
